
Since domains of study are contingent on the habitus in which they are nested, the nature of each domain and how they relate with each other (whether they overlap/intersect or is a subset of another) have nuances in different places.

For instance, in Malaysia, Sinology, China Studies and Chinese Overseas Studies respectively correspond to civilizational, state and ethnic contexts and are influenced by identity politics (Ngeow *et al.* 2017, Clemente 2020).

The Philippine experience is more amorphous — a kind of ambiguity that reflects the eclecticism pervading the study of subject matter related to the Chinese and China. The absence of strict categories in subject matter does not necessarily reveal a crisis but instead shows flexibility and various ongoing negotiations in the knowledge production space (Clemente 2018, 2020).

Scholarship on the history, migration, and identity, for instance, of Chinese in the Philippines is also considered within Philippine Studies. China, Chinese, and Chineseness do not always have strict demarcations as subjects, nor do scholars have strictly separate communities (Clemente and Shih 2018).
















